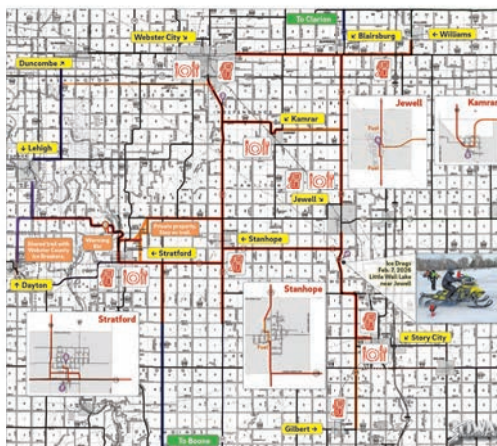

Bodensteiner Named ACSA Dealer of the Year

Bodensteiner Motor Sports in New Hampton followed up their state award last fall as Iowa's Snowmobile Dealer of the Year with the national award in the same category at the 2025 International Snowmobile Congress (ISC) at Prince Edward Island in June.

As a state award winner, Bodensteiner was automatically entered into the American Council of Snowmobile Associations (ACSA) competition for 2025. The Region 4 dealership became the eighth dealer from Iowa to win the prestigious honor since 2002.

ISSA President Matt Miner accepted the ACSA award on behalf of Bodensteiner at the June 14 banquet at ISC in northeast Canada. Later that summer, he presented the plaque to dealership staff, including sales manager Bryan Dungey and service manager Neil Kaumans. They said they were "humbled" by both awards.

"When we won the state award, we were very excited to be recognized for all of the hard work that goes behind the scenes at our dealership," Dungey said. "Then Matt lets us know we won the ACSA award as well. To say we were surprised is an understatement. This award means a lot to everyone here, and we hope to serve the snowmobiling community for years to come."

Bodensteiner Motor Sports is located within Bodensteiner Implement, a John Deere dealer near the intersection of Highways 18 and 63, just outside of New Hampton. They sell and service Ski-Doo and Lynx snowmobiles as well as Can-Am Off-Road vehicles and Kawasaki UTVs and

personal watercraft.

The dealership previously sold Arctic Cat snowmobiles and had acquired the motor sports division when Bodensteiner purchased Boos Implement 15 years ago. Boos had entered the snowmobile market after purchasing B&D Sports, a long-time Ski-Doo and Arctic Cat dealer in the area.

Bodensteiner is proud to keep the tradition going and is committed to serving the local snowmobile community. The dealership is open six days a week for sales, parts and service, and when trail conditions warrant, the service department stays late and works long hours to get customers back to riding as quickly as possible.

"We are not a huge dealer by any means, and we might not always be the cheapest, but our customer service is second to none," Dungey said. "The customer isn't a number when they walk in our door. They get individualized attention, and their needs are met."

The dealership is also a strong backer of the local snowmobile club, the Chickasaw Sno-Riders. Like other staff members, both Dungey and Kaumans are club members with the latter serving as a past president and current club treasurer. Prospective and current members can sign up or renew their dues at the dealership.

According to Kaumans, Bodensteiner actively promotes club activities, and the dealer lot serves as a trailhead for out-of-town riders with a connector trail leading right out the front gate. They have also lent out its shop to work on the club's groomer. With all of this support, it's easy to see why the club nominated the dealership for the state award last fall.

"From a club standpoint, having a business like Bodensteiner Motor Sports supporting us is a blessing," Kaumans said. "As an employee, I get to see all of the good deeds Bodensteiner does for the club from the inside, and I can say that 90 percent of those deeds are done quietly without the company ever getting praise or recognition for doing them.

"That says a lot for the character of the employees and the upper management of Bodensteiner Implement," Kaumans con-

tinued. "There is so much that Bodensteiner and its employees do for the club, and to be recognized like this means a tremendous amount to me personally and professionally."

"We're proud of all our dealers and the work they do to keep snowmobiling alive in Iowa," Miner said. "We understand the challenges they face as a business in a marginal snow state, because we see it as an organization too. So for an Iowa dealer to earn this recognition, everyone in Iowa should be proud of their accomplishment."

Year-Round Effort

ISTGP Update: Recapping last season, previewing this winter, including equipment upgrades

For the ISSA and the Iowa Snowmobile Trail Grant Program (ISTGP), the snowmobile season never truly ends. One year flows into the next.

Our responsibilities include equipment purchases, moves and repairs, while also providing support to clubs as they work with landowners and local, county and state agencies to maintain and develop their trails.

Without the great support of my Co-Admin John Kahler, ISSA Board, ISTGP Committee and the Iowa Department of Natural Resources (IDNR), I would not be able to share with you the great news to follow in this article.

The program has achieved goals like paying the clubs to groom, the purchase of new equipment, and building a fiscally solid program with funds in reserve should the need arise. These are major goals we set nine years ago. I want to personally thank them for their support, hard work and dedication.

Our role as ISTGP can be confusing and even misunderstood. We are here to provide guidance, support, and information.

We want to get as much money back to the clubs while still maintaining a budget and fair distribution of those funds. Because



every club has a unique trail system, ISSA and ISTGP do not mandate trail placement or signage requirements. Instead, clubs are trusted

to make decisions that best serve their area, while we remain available as a resource.

Cooperative agreement

There are some changes for the upcoming season. There will be an Updated Cooperative Agreement for the 2025–26 season, ISSA/ISTGP is implementing an updated Trail Grant Cooperative Agreement after questions and concerns were raised. The previous agreement—based on the IDNR's version—was correct, but the committee decided it needed clearer wording.

The updated version has been reviewed by both the ISTGP Committee, ISSA Executive Board and the IDNR and is now finalized. This agreement serves as both a

contract and a lease, outlining what clubs can expect from ISTGP and what is expected in return.

Because ISTGP owns most of the grooming equipment, we must maintain a zero-dollar lease agreement with each club. This agreement ensures insurance and legal protection for both the program and the clubs.

Key points to consider:

- Clubs lease equipment from ISTGP at no cost.
- Clubs are paid \$11 per mile groomed using leased equipment.
- Agreements will be sent out in October and must be signed and returned for clubs to be eligible for both equipment use and end-of-season payments.

2024-25 reimbursements

The ISTGP Grant Committee met on June 23 in Ames to review grant reimbursements, equipment requests and trail development projects. Reimbursements and payments were approved and paid.

Because a large part of the state experienced low snow fall, the committee decided clubs that groomed 45 miles or less would be paid a flat \$500 payment for groomer maintenance and service. This was 32 clubs totaling \$16,000. Above that total, 17 clubs reported over 45 miles groomed for a combined total of 2,169.3 miles. These clubs were reimbursed at \$11 per mile for a total of \$23,862.30.

The GPS data provided by the GTS tracking system was used to provide this information. Groomer repair reimbursements totaled \$6,539.99. Total reimburse-

ments of \$30,398.99 were paid out to clubs last season.

Along with the club's operational costs, we also have insurance costs of \$81,846 for trail insurance and groomer coverage for equipment purchased with Recreational Trails Program (RTP) funds.

Our agreement with the IDNR to run the Snowmobile Trail Program requires a yearly audit. The audit is performed by a third-party firm. The 2024-25 season audit found no issues or concerns, and only one suggestion on the reporting side of the QuickBooks program we use. The IDNR reported that they are very pleased with the program's current standing and direction.

Trail development

During the selection meeting, the committee reviews all requests for equipment updates and any trail development requests. We approved two trail development requests this year.

1. Snowdrifters Snowmobile Club – Financial assistance to re-deck two bridges.
2. Snow Pioneers Snowmobile Club – Support in partnership with the DNR to replace snowmobile gates at three Backbone State Park entrances.

The final dollar amounts will be reported on next year's report after projects are complete, and the proper reimbursement documentation is received.

Equipment requests

Each year, the ISTGP Committee reviews all equipment requests and builds a priority list based on the following criteria:

November Election for Central Representative on ISTGP Board

The Iowa Snowmobile Trail Grant Program (ISTGP) will be holding an election Nov. 15 at the ISSA's 52nd Annual Convention for the Central Iowa Representative committee seat. Incumbent John Gallentine currently serves in that role.

Nominations are due Oct. 15. Nominees do not need to be a member of the ISSA. The only qualifications are to own a currently registered snowmobile in Iowa and reside in the Central Region. A map showing boundary lines is available at iowasnowmobiler.com/trailgrantprogram/rscmap.jpg

The election will be at noon at the Quality Inn & Suites in Ames as part of the ISTGP annual update. Voters do not need to be registered for convention to participate in the election. As with the nominee, they do, however, need to be a registered snowmobiler in Iowa.

- Location of the club in relation to historic snowfall
- Historical grooming activity
- Age and condition of current equipment
- How many years has the club been requesting equipment

We have over 20 years of grooming data from logs and reports that we can refer to in our decisions on equipment placement. Once the priority list is built, we then contact the clubs and discuss what equipment they feel works best for their area and their ability for financial partnership if they choose to have some ownership in the equipment. This is based on a percentage to keep the club and programs ownership relative as the value of the equipment changes.

The committee works very diligently to make sure this list is fair and accurate in the placement of equipment. It is a NEW list put together every year. We share the list and the explanations with it at ISSA meetings and the annual ISTGP Update meeting during convention.

This list is very fluid and ever evolving as clubs change what they want and how they want to partner. Other factors like what's available for equipment and timing of getting the equipment play a big factor as well.

For those reasons, the list isn't published or sent out to the clubs as some have asked for. When we get to convention, we know what we're able to do for the year, and we share what we're doing at that time. Please attend a meeting or convention if you want to know more about the groomer selection process.

Looking ahead

We are pleased to report several major equipment purchases heading into the upcoming season:

- 2025 Tucker Terra 2000 purchased for the Trail Blaz-zers Snowmobile Club and second one secured through RTP funding with the final destination to be determined.
- Ordered seven new Mogul Master drags:
 - > (1) nine-foot wide drag for Dickinson Count
 - > (3) medium-duty drags for Humboldt, O'Brien and Dubuque counties
 - > (2) light-duty drags for High Bridge and Team Iowa
 - > (1) spare unit to be placed where needed

Additional equipment updates:

- Allamakee Co snowmobile club will receive the tractor with loader previously used by Trail Blaz-zers.
- Saylorville Dam snowmobile club will be getting a rubber track groomer to meet Story County Conservation's requirements for operating on the Heart of Iowa bike trail.

The ISSA and ISTGP remain committed to supporting clubs, maintaining strong relationships with state partners and ensuring that Iowa's snowmobile trails continue to improve year after year.

With updated agreements, new equipment and strong cooperation across the state, the 2025-26 season is already shaping up to be a successful one. We just need that main ingredient: SNOW.

In Memoriam

Past President Martin Passed Away in August

Past ISSA President Dan Martin of Eldridge passed away Aug. 31. He was 87 years old.

A former president of Scott County Sno-Seekers in Region 9, Martin was elected as a director to the ISSA in 1980 and became Vice President a year later. He served as president of the organization from 1984-85.

Martin is being remembered for his lasting contributions to organized snowmobiling, both in Iowa and nationally. Besides volunteering for the ISSA, he served on various committees for the International Snowmobile Congress and was inducted into the International Snowmobile Hall of Fame (ISHOF) in 1991.

A long-time insurance agent in Davenport, Martin most notably developed the snowmobile trail insurance program in 1985 alongside fellow Past ISSA President Dale Vagts of Cresco. The program continues today with affordable coverage provided to more than 700 clubs across 24 states.

Martin is survived by four children. A memorial visitation will be held Oct. 11 from noon to 3 p.m. at The Runge Mortuary in Davenport.

Better Late Than Never

Tardy snowfall shortens Iowa riding season to about two weeks total

Making the most of groomer-carved trails along Highway 175 between Jewell and Stanhope in Region 7 Feb. 23. Lured to Little Wall Lake by groomer updates on the GTS Trails app.

Snowmobilers in Iowa endured another lackluster winter last year with in-state riding opportunities limited to a 10-day stretch in the middle of February and another short-lived burst in early March. Most of that snow fell in central and western Iowa with the northern and eastern portions of the state seeing very little of the white stuff.

The Iowa Climatology Bureau, which recognizes the three-month period of December through February as the “meteorological winter,” reported a statewide average of just 8.8 inches of snow last winter, or 13 inches below average, the fourth least snowiest winter in 138 years of recordkeeping for the state.

“January is climatologically the driest month of the year for Iowa,” observed Iowa Climatologist Justin Gilsan in his winter weather summary for last year. “Most of the northern one-third of Iowa experienced the driest January in 153 years of statewide records, and multiple stations reported no measurable precipitation.”

Extend last year’s riding season to include the bookend months of November and March, and Iowa saw just 14.4 inches of snow, the lowest total in 25 years of tracking snowfall totals by this publication. The year prior saw 23.7 inches of snow, while the win-

ter of 2009-10 saw the highest total of 49.2 inches of snow during that same period. See the chart on page 14 for complete historical data. The statewide average for that same period hovers around 31 inches.

Compounding the situation last winter was unseasonably warm temperatures with both January and February recording thermometer readings in the 60s in Iowa. Mirroring a similar pattern from the year prior, the above-average mercury limited grooming efforts across the state and led to the cancellation of several ice-related activities during the season.

Among those events were the Midwest Sled Fest at Clear Lake, Team Iowa Ice Drags in Jewell and Iowa River Riders’ inaugural Snow Rodeo at Lake Cornelia, all scheduled for February. A month earlier, the lack of decent snowcover impacted snowmobile events at Snowfest in Cresco and the Iowa Winter Games at Okoboji.

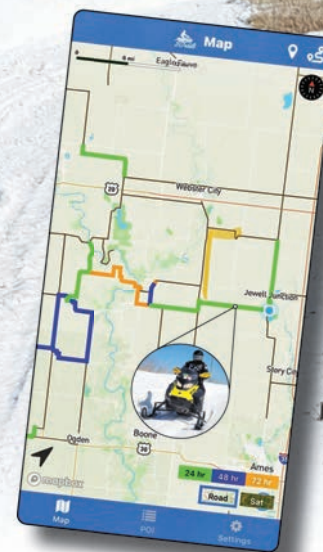
None of the four Snowmobile Iowa state rides was held last winter either, making the decision by the ISSA to cut the ride schedule in half a wise move, given the recent trend for poor trail conditions in Iowa.

Timely snow for Team Iowa

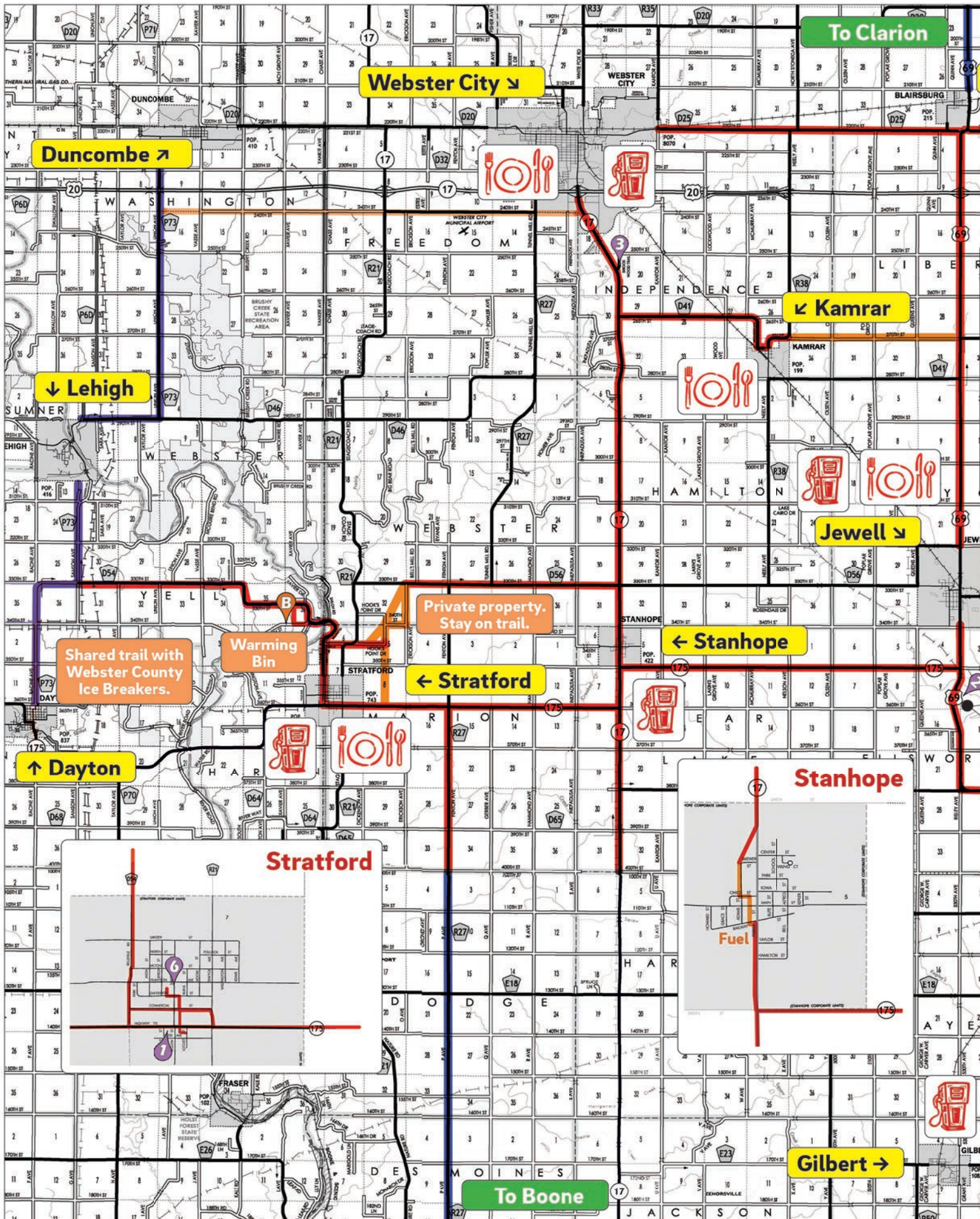
About the only bright spot from last winter came in the middle of February when a pair of weather events produced rideable snow in a band in western and central Iowa between Highways 20 and 30. The Feb. 13-14 storm system brought a combined eight inches of snow to Regions 7 and 8, and high winds and drifting snow filled the ditches on the local trail systems.

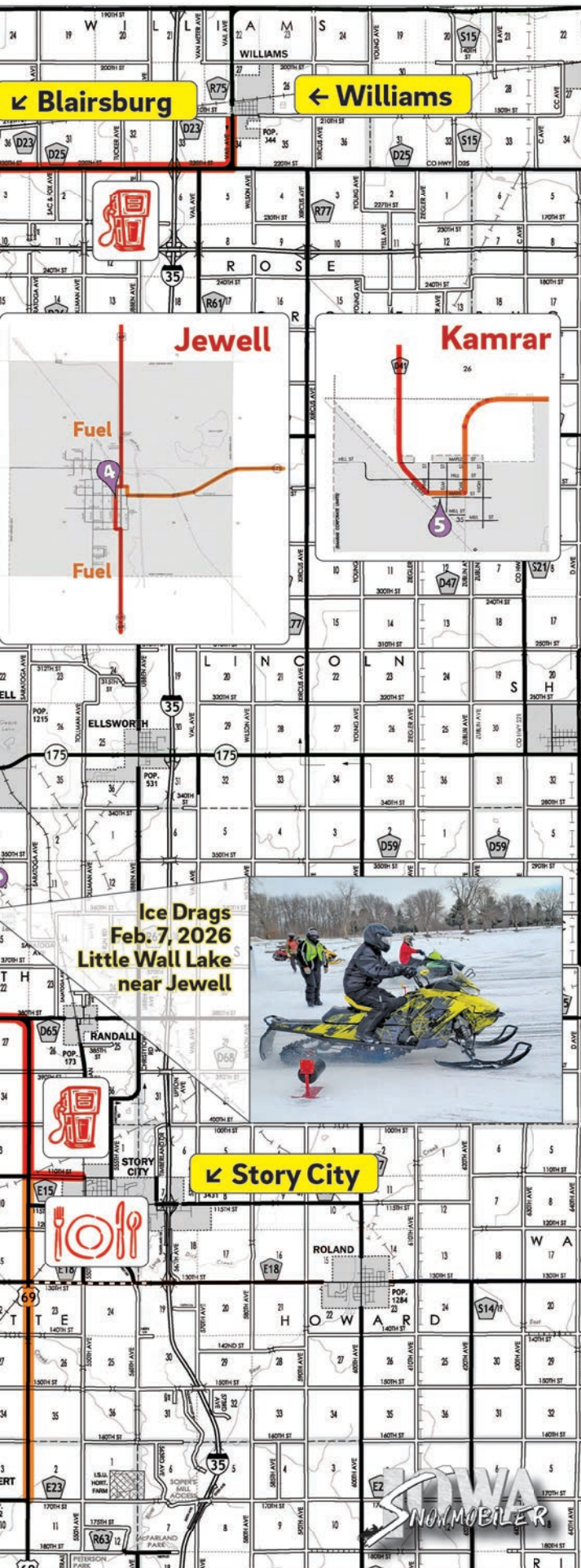
For Team Iowa, the snow allowed the Region 7 club to test out their “new-to-them” 2000 Bombardier BR180 groomer. “This thing’s a beast. Works great,” club president David Eide said in a social media post during two days of continuous grooming. Team Iowa maintains 125 miles of trail in and around Hamilton County, as shown on their trail map in this month’s center spread.

With his 15-year-old daughter, Breckyn, riding shotgun, Eide posted frequent trail updates on the club’s Facebook page with photos documenting their progress and screenshots from the GTS Trails app showing their coverage. With help from other volunteer operators, the groomer was getting a good workout, running day and night.



Temperatures climbed above 50 by the afternoon of Feb. 23 and made the snow disappear like a slice of watermelon in July.

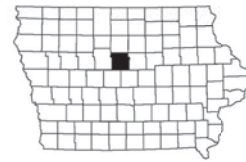

Those posts led to this reporter spending Sunday, Feb. 23, on Team Iowa trails. After fueling in Jewell, we unloaded at Little Wall Lake south of town and followed the groomed trail to Stanhope. We had planned on a longer day, but like Eide predicted, the afternoon sun and rising temperatures thwarted our efforts, shortening the ride to just 40 miles. We still appreciated what was left of the groomed trails and made the most of the opportunity.

According to the Iowa Snowmobile Trail Grant Program (ISTGP), Team Iowa finished the season with 206 miles of trail groomed last winter, with neighboring club, the Webster County Ice Break-

ers, leading the state with 222 miles. Central Iowa Snowmobilers were second at 211 miles, and Sno-Pak in Region 2 rounded out the top four grooming totals from last winter at 187 miles.

Close to two-thirds of the clubs in Iowa did not even groom last season, highlighting the widespread reach of poor snow conditions across the state. The ISTGP still awarded each club \$500 to cover pre-season trail and equipment maintenance expenses.

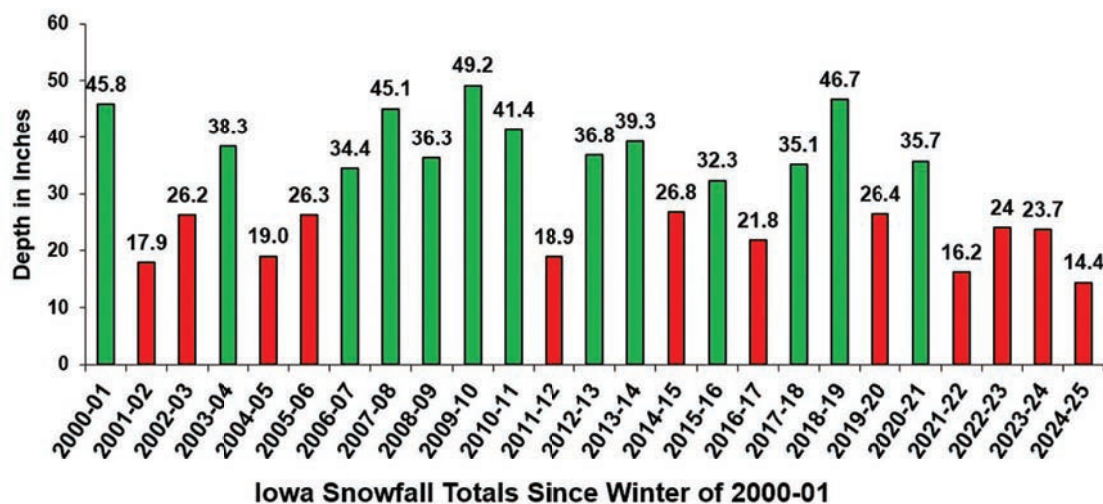
ISSA President Matt Miner is hoping to stop the bleeding this

Also designed to attract more youth to Ames this year will be ISSA's Grand Raffle drawing of a new 2024 Ski Doo MXZ 200 snowmobile. Only 500 tickets have been printed for this giveaway. Tickets cost \$20 each, so the odds of winning are pretty favorable. The drawing will be held during the Saturday evening banquet following the catered meal.

As always, the ISSA's annual awards will be handed out Saturday night as well. For the guest speaker, the planning committee is trying to line up a professional snowmobile racer for the evening, and following all formal festivities, the banquet floor will be converted to games, music and entertainment to close out the evening.

Taking a much-deserved break on legislative front

Officials with the ISSA were able to catch their breath last winter after spending the previous 10 legislative sessions lobbying state politicians to merge the trail pass and annual registration period into one sticker for snowmobiles in Iowa. They accomplished that mission in May of 2024.

"Getting done what we did last year with the single-sticker bill was huge for our program," acknowledged Past ISSA President Jim Willey, chair of the ISSA's Legislative Committee. "It really boosts our funding for grooming equipment, and we couldn't have gotten it done without the grassroots support of our clubs and the dedication of our lobbyists."

Mike Heller, a Des Moines-based lawyer, and his partner, Paula Feltner, have represented the ISSA for 23 years now. They came on board after the Iowa Legislature swept more than \$1 million in snowmobile program reserves in 2002. At one point, their annual compensation rose to \$26,500, but lately, they only receive the proceeds from the ISSA's Club Challenge for their services.

"They've been working for us for basically what clubs donate," Willey noted at the ISSA's August board meeting. "They keep working for us due to their loyalty to our organization. What we give them doesn't even really cover their expenses, so that's why it's important for clubs to keep contributing to the Club Challenge."

During their tenure, the ISSA's lobbyists have been able to get the \$1 million restored, move snowmobiles to an annual registration period and turn the trail maintenance portion of the state snowmobile program to the ISSA, now managed by the Iowa Snowmobile Trail Grant Program. After the fee merger last year, Willey said they earned a much-deserved break and have been simply keeping an eye on things in Des Moines.

"It's been pretty quiet on the legislative front. We've been discussing moving the one-time registration for vintage snowmobiles to a rolling 25-year period, but we haven't done much with that," Willey said. "Basically, our lobbyists have been watching different bills for us at the Iowa Legislature and letting us know if certain issues come up. If it's not a direct impact on snowmobiling, we normally don't take a stance."

Clubs can make their lobbyist contributions at the ISSA 52nd Annual Convention next month in Ames. They are also being asked to bring other donations for the ISSA's official charities for collection at the Saturday morning brunch. The official roster of club donations can be found on page 23 of this month's issue. Please note the ISSA's fundraising year renews at convention each November.
